**DEBRIS COLLECTION UPDATE**

THE WOODLANDS, TEXAS (Thursday, September 28, 2017, 5 p.m.)

**HARRIS COUNTY**

The Township's contracted debris removal in the Village of Creekside Park (Harris County) through Waste Management has concluded.

Based upon information from Harris County, their county crews are working seven days a week in order to remove storm debris. They will continue this work until all debris is removed. However, there is not a specific timeline, route or schedule. Harris County requests that residents remain patient, as the debris removal includes the unincorporated areas of the county, making it difficult to accurately predict a timeline for completion.

Residents of unincorporated Harris County who wish to drop off storm debris or construction debris should take it to 13928 Humble Road, Tomball, TX, 77577. The facility is open seven days a week from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Residents must show proof of residence in Harris County. If a resident hires a third party to remove and deliver debris to this facility, the resident must accompany the contractor in order to show proof of residence.

## MONTGOMERY COUNTY

Montgomery County Precinct 3 has been providing debris removal for Montgomery County residents of The Woodlands. Precinct 3 Commissioner James Noack submitted a report to the Township Board of Directors on September 27, 2017. The report indicated the following:

- Precinct 3 has completed a first pass of all properties with storm debris in the Township. About 215 homes were serviced during the first pass. A second pass will be made to assist the remaining homes with storm debris.
- Montgomery County debris pick-up will conclude for the entire county on October 16, 2017.
- The debris drop-off center at 1122 Pruitt Road is open on Friday, September 29, 2017, closed on Saturday, and open on Sunday, October 1, 2017, from 7 a.m. – 5 p.m. October 1, 2017 will be the final day for debris drop-off free of charge. Beginning on October 2, standard rates will apply for recycling/debris drop-off.
