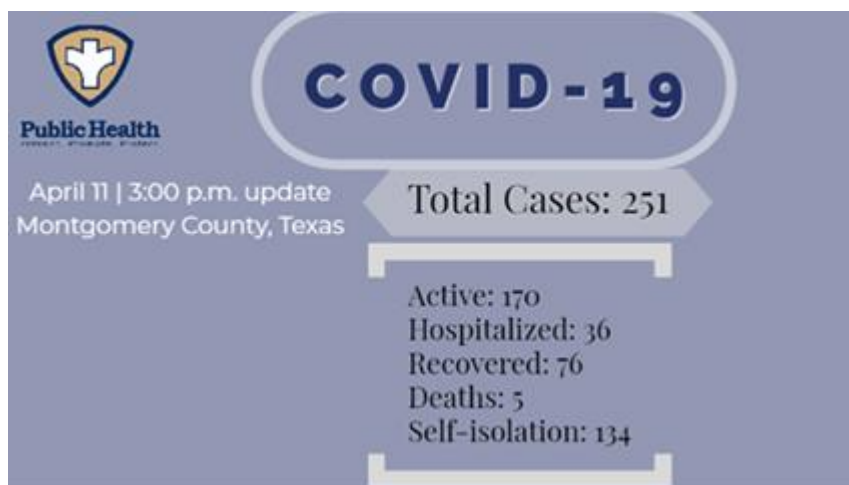
MONTGOMERY COUNTY – Montgomery County Public Health District, in conjunction with Montgomery County Office of Emergency Management, is saddened to confirm the 5th death related to COVID-19 in Montgomery County. He was a man in his 80s, who was a resident of The Conservatory at Alden Bridge. This is the 4th death related to the senior living apartment complex.

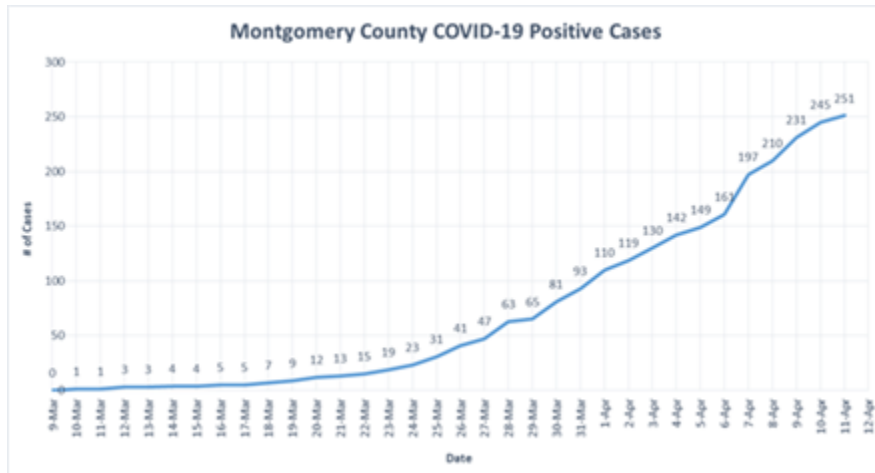
We do have some very good news to report! Our Case #1, who had been in critical condition since early March, has been released from the hospital! We are so happy that he is doing well and is on the road to recovery.

We can confirm there are now 251 total positive cases of COVID-19, up 6 cases from yesterday. Due to the low volume of test results received on the weekends, we will no longer report new numbers on Sundays. We are reallocating our staff to mid-week to account for the peak volume of test results. We will also be hiring two additional epidemiologists to our team to help with the increasing number of positive COVID-19 tests.
