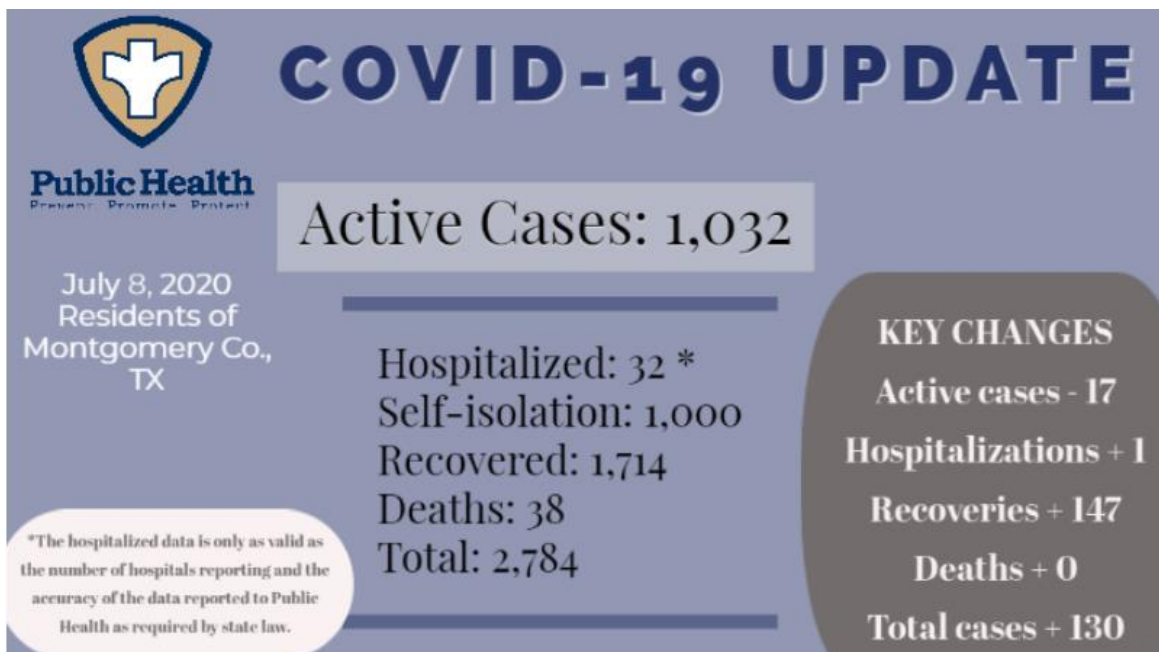
Status Update from the Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE:

July 8, 2020

MONTGOMERY COUNTY – Montgomery County Public Health District, in conjunction with Montgomery County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, can confirm the total number of COVID-19 cases increased by 130 to 2,784 cases in Montgomery County. ACTIVE cases of COVID-19 decreased to 1,032. Of the 1,032 active cases who are Montgomery County residents, 32 are in the hospital. 1,714 people have fully recovered.

Take the steps needed to reduce the spread of COVID-19. Avoid groups of people. Wear a mask (if it is necessary to be in public), wash your hands or use hand sanitizer frequently, disinfect surfaces in your car and around your home, and practice social distancing. We have the power to keep businesses and restaurants open.

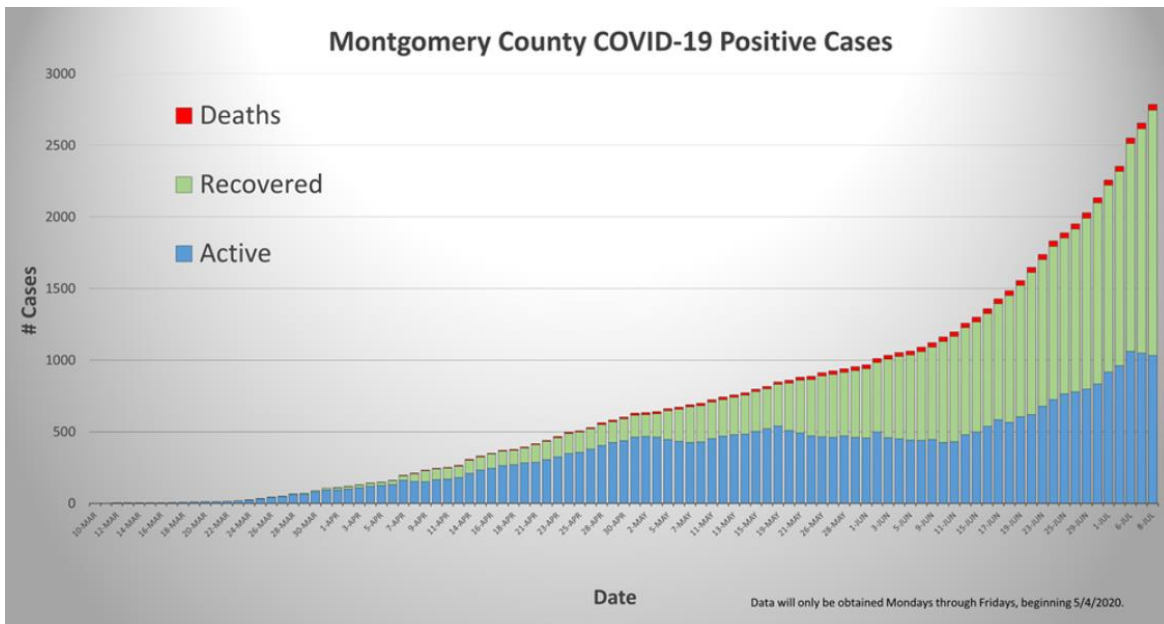
ICU: 54
