



MONTGOMERY COUNTY OFFICIALS UPDATE CORONAVIRUS OUTBREAK

Status Update from the Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management

MONTGOMERY COUNTY – Montgomery County Public Health District, in conjunction with the Montgomery County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, is saddened to confirm an additional death related to COVID-19, bringing the total to 50. A woman in her 70s, from Montgomery, died in the hospital. She had co-morbidities in addition to testing positive for COVID-19.

We can also confirm:

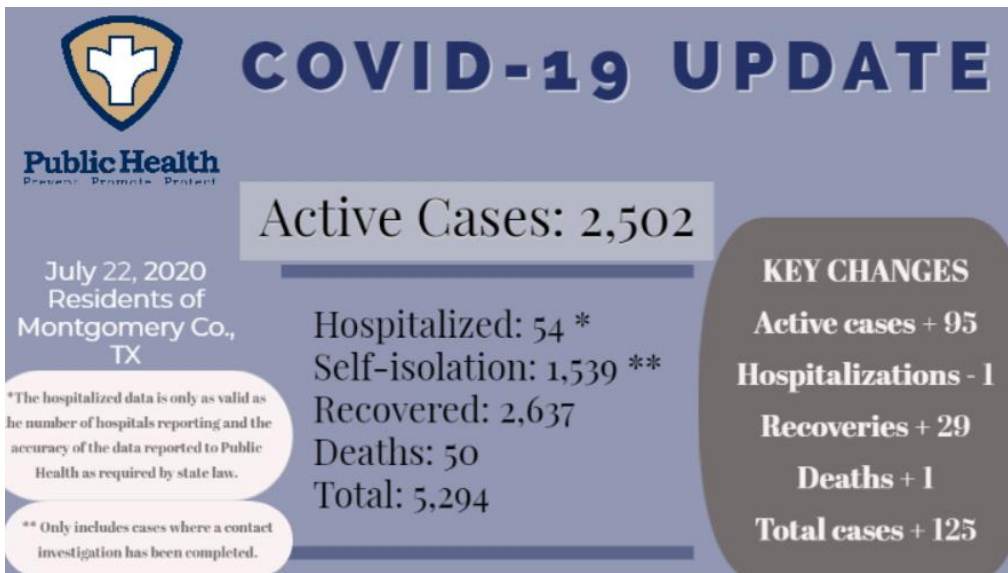
- TOTAL cases of COVID-19 increased by 125 to 5,294.
- ACTIVE cases of COVID-19 increased by 95 to 2,502.
- 54 residents are known to be in the hospital, as a result of contact investigations. Contact investigations have not been initiated on all reported cases.
- 2,637 people have clinically recovered.

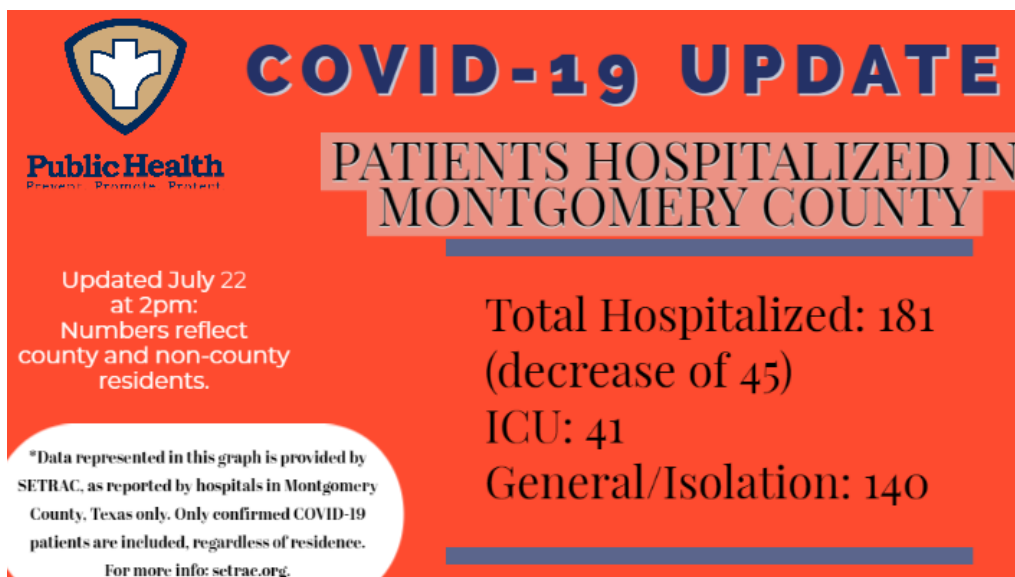
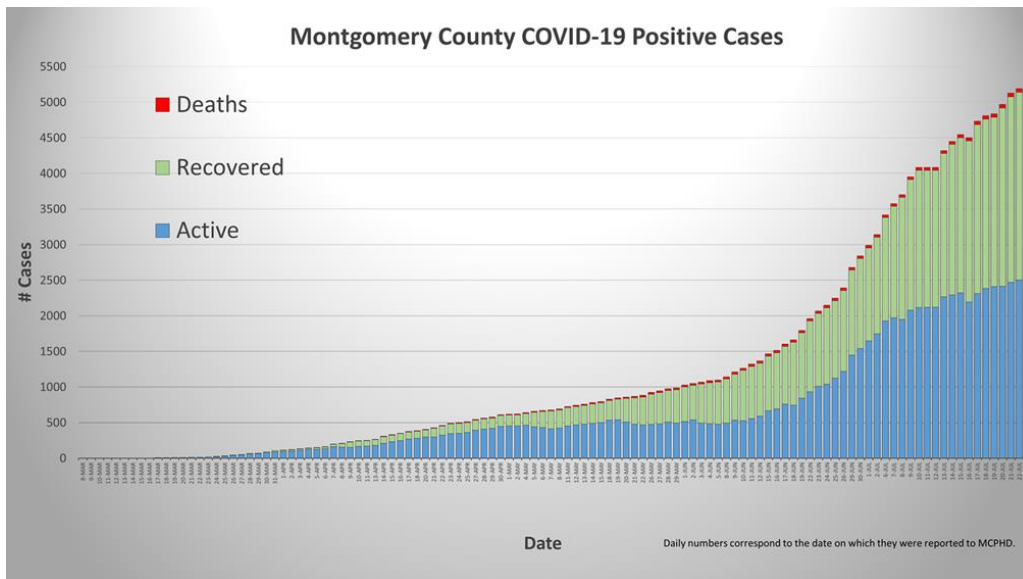
Take steps to slow the spread of COVID-19 in our community.

As of 7/15/2020, this graph is based on dates that positive tests were reported to MCPHD – not to the public. This ensures the data is a true reflection of when the cases were positive and accrued. As of 7/16/2020, we make cases inactive who our staff has been unable to contact for more than 30 days.
