



## **MONTGOMERY COUNTY OFFICIALS UPDATE CORONAVIRUS OUTBREAK**

*Status Update from the Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management*

**FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE:  
July 23, 2020**

MONTGOMERY COUNTY – Montgomery County Public Health District, in conjunction with the Montgomery County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, is saddened to confirm three additional deaths related to COVID-19, bringing the total to 53. A woman in her 80s from Willis, a woman in her 50s from Conroe, and a man in his 70s from Conroe all died in the hospital. All patients had co-morbidities in addition to testing positive for COVID-19. We offer our condolences to each family at this difficult time.

We can also confirm:

- TOTAL cases of COVID-19 increased by 150 to 5,444.
- ACTIVE cases of COVID-19 increased by 37 to 2,539.
- 63 residents are known to be in the hospital, as a result of contact investigations. Contact investigations have not been initiated on all reported cases.
- 2,747 people have clinically recovered.

\*Changes reflected since yesterday's report.

- Avoid groups of people.
- Practice social distancing.
- Wear a mask (if it is necessary to leave your home).
- Wash your hands or use hand sanitizer frequently.

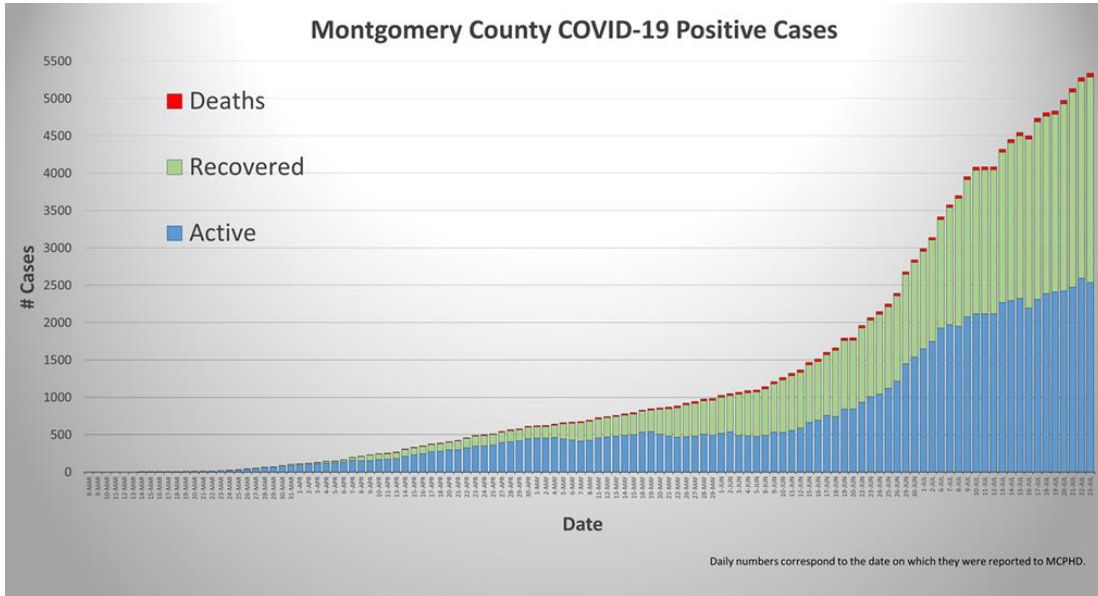
