Daily COVID-19 Update for Montgomery County

Status Update from the Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management

MONTGOMERY COUNTY – Montgomery County Public Health District, in conjunction with the Montgomery County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, can confirm five additional deaths related to COVID-19. Three hospitalized men, one in their 80s and 2 in their 60s, one from Conroe and two from Magnolia have died. All had co-morbidities in addition to testing positive for COVID-19. The two out-of-hospital deaths are a female in her 90s from Spring and a male in his 60s from New Caney.

We can also confirm the following:

- TOTAL cases of COVID-19 increased by 87 to 6,077 since yesterday's report.
- ACTIVE cases of COVID-19 decreased by 79 to 2,464 since yesterday's report.
- 69 residents are known to be in the hospital, as a result of contact investigations. Contact investigations have not been initiated on all reported cases.
- 3,446 people have clinically recovered an increase of 161 since yesterday's report.


