Daily COVID-19 Update for Montgomery County

Status Update from the Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management

MONTGOMERY COUNTY – Montgomery County Public Health District, in conjunction with the Montgomery County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, can sadly confirm five additional deaths related to COVID-19.


- A man in his 60s, from Conroe, died in the hospital. He had co-morbidities in addition to testing positive for COVID-19.
- A woman in her 70s, from Porter, died in hospice care. She had co-morbidities in addition to testing positive for COVID-19.
- A woman in her 70s, from The Woodlands, died in hospice care. She had co-morbidities in addition to testing positive for COVID-19.
- A woman in her 80s, from Conroe, died in hospice care. She had co-morbidities in addition to testing positive for COVID-19.
- A man in his 80s, from Conroe, died in hospice care. He had co-morbidities in addition to testing positive for COVID-19.

We offer our condolences to all five families at this difficult time.

We can also confirm:

- TOTAL cases of COVID-19 increased by 146 to 8,268 since yesterday's report.
 - We are continuing to process cases that were reported to The Department of State Health Services (DSHS) directly by healthcare providers and entered into the National Electronic Disease Surveillance System (NEDSS), run by the CDC. Out of the 146 new total cases since yesterday's report, 94 (from the NEDSS system) tested positive prior to August 11th. - ACTIVE cases of COVID-19 decreased by 310 to 1,169 since yesterday's report. On Tuesdays, we factor in additional cases we have been unable to contact for more than 30 days. That represents 341 additional "inactive" cases today.
- 48 residents are known to be in the hospital, as a result of contact investigations. Contact investigations have not been initiated on all reported cases.
- 5,763 people have clinically recovered.

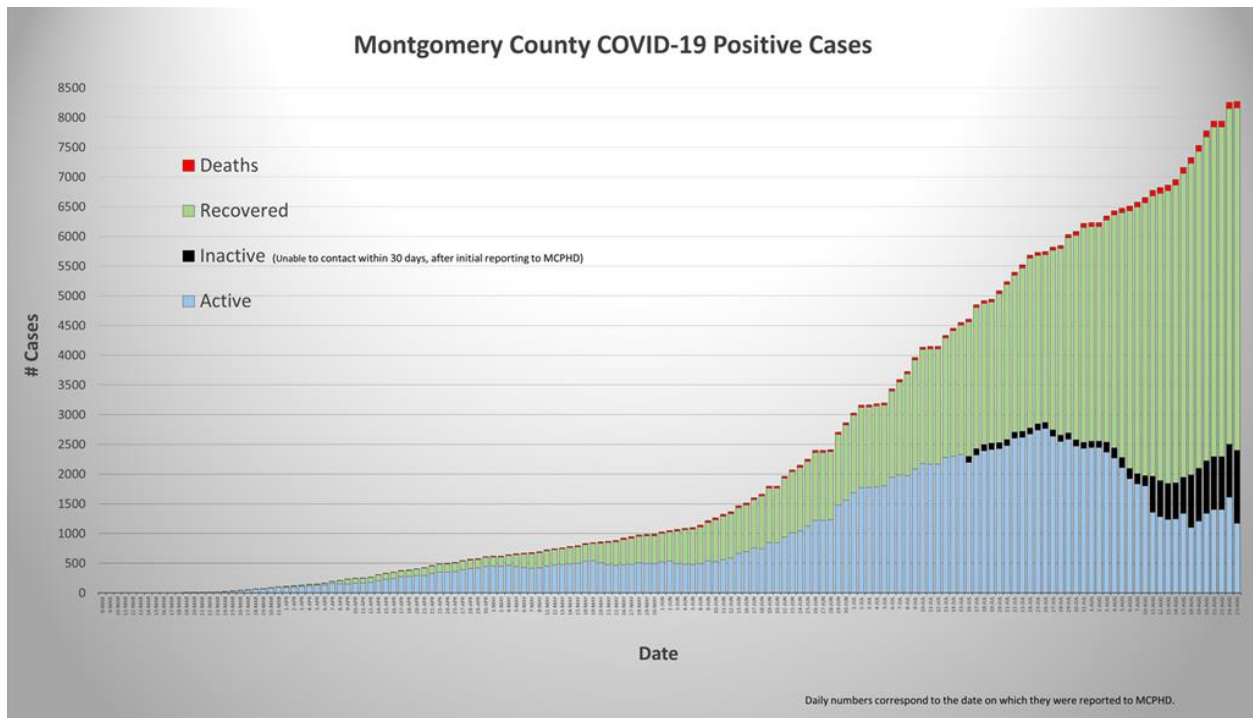
