Daily COVID-19 Update for Montgomery County

Status Update from the Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management

MONTGOMERY COUNTY – Montgomery County Public Health District, in conjunction with the Montgomery County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, can confirm the following update related to COVID-19.

- TOTAL cases of COVID-19 increased by 238 to 11,682 since yesterday's (10/5) report.
 - We have continued to process cases that were reported to The Department of State Health Services (DSHS) directly by healthcare providers and entered into the National Electronic Disease Surveillance System (NEDSS). Out of the 238 new cases today, 79 were tested prior to 9/21.
- ACTIVE cases of COVID-19 decreased by 54 to 1,576 since yesterday's (10/5) report. On Tuesdays, we factor in cases as "inactive" who we have been unable to contact for more than 30 days. This accounts for an additional 202 inactive cases today.
- 14 residents are known to be in the hospital, as a result of contact investigations. Contact investigations have not been initiated on all reported cases.
- 7,774 people have clinically recovered.

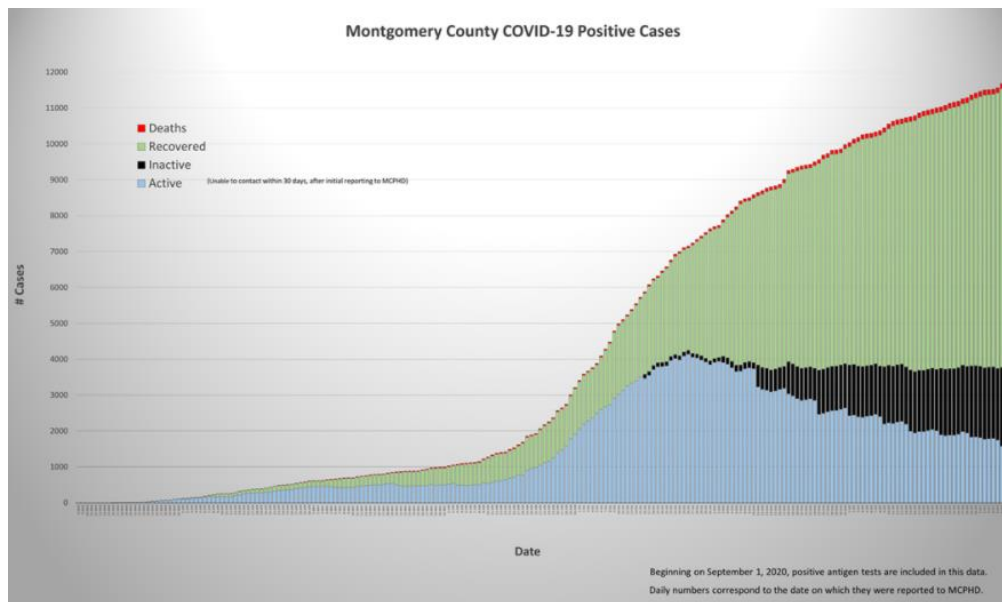
