Daily COVID-19 Update for Montgomery County

Status Update from the Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management

MONTGOMERY COUNTY – Montgomery County Public Health District, in conjunction with the Montgomery County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, can sadly confirm four additional deaths related to COVID-19.

- A woman in her 40s, from Conroe, died in the hospital. There were no co-morbidities noted in her medical records, but there were additional factors that led to her death.
- A woman in her 40s, from Magnolia, died in the hospital. She had co-morbidities in addition to testing positive for COVID-19.
- A woman in her 40s, from Conroe, died in the hospital. She had co-morbidities in addition to testing positive for COVID-19.
- A woman in her 80s, from Spring, died at home. There were no co-morbidities noted in her medical records.

We can also confirm:

- TOTAL cases of COVID-19 increased by 221 to 13,796 since Friday's (10/26) report. All cases were tested in the month of October.
- ACTIVE cases of COVID-19 increased by 156 to 2,362 since Friday's (10/26) report.
- 33 residents are known, as a result of contact investigations, to be in the hospital. Contact investigations have not been initiated on all reported cases.
- 8,743 people have clinically recovered.

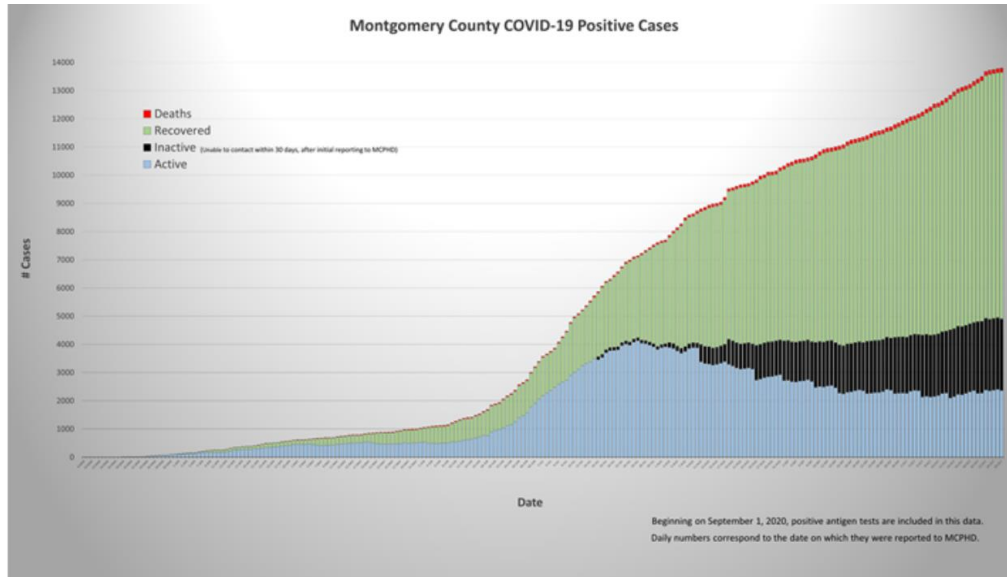
