## **Daily COVID-19 Update for Montgomery County**

*Status Update from the Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management*


MONTGOMERY COUNTY – Montgomery County Public Health District, in conjunction with the Montgomery County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, can sadly confirm an additional death related to COVID-19.

A man in his 80s, from Magnolia, died while in hospice care. He had co-morbidities in addition to testing positive for COVID-19.

We can also confirm:

- TOTAL cases of COVID-19 increased by 70 to 14,227 since Friday's (10/30) report. All cases were tested in the last 7 days.
- ACTIVE cases of COVID-19 increased by 4 to 2,348 since Friday's (10/30) report.
- 38 residents are known, as a result of contact investigations, to be in the hospital. Contact investigations have not been initiated on all reported cases.
- 9,027 people have clinically recovered.

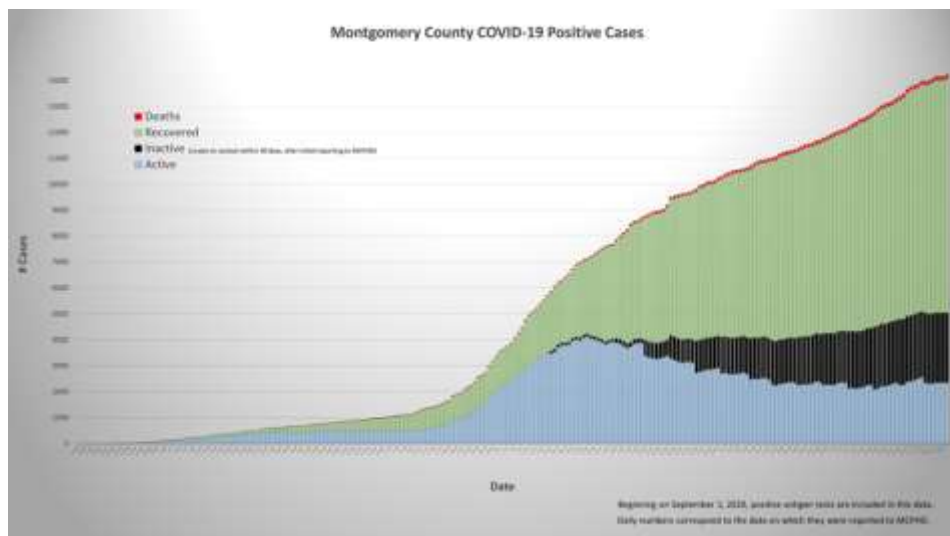
