Daily COVID-19 Update for Montgomery County

Status Update from the Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management

MONTGOMERY COUNTY – Montgomery County Public Health District, in conjunction with the Montgomery County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, can sadly confirm three additional deaths related to COVID-19.

- A woman in her 50s, from Pinehurst, died in the hospital. She had co-morbidities in addition to testing positive for COVID-19.
- A man in his 50s, from Montgomery, died in the hospital. There were no co-morbidities noted in his medical records.
- A woman in her 90s, from Montgomery, died in the hospital. There were no co-morbidities noted in her medical records.

We can also confirm:

- TOTAL cases of COVID-19 increased by 119 to 14,912 since yesterday's (11/12) report. All 119 new cases were tested in the month of November.
- ACTIVE cases of COVID-19 increased by 116 to 2,395 since yesterday's (11/12) report.
- 31 residents are known, as a result of contact investigations, to be in the hospital. Contact investigations have not been initiated on all reported cases.
- 9,271 people have clinically recovered. Recovery data is unavailable at this time due to the ongoing database transition. We appreciate your patience.


