Daily COVID-19 Update for Montgomery County

Status Update from the Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management

MONTGOMERY COUNTY – Montgomery County Public Health District, in conjunction with the Montgomery County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, would like to encourage all residents to do your part to slow the spread of COVID-19. Until this virus is under control, please recommit to following these guidelines:

- Avoid groups of people.
- Practice social distancing.
- Wear a mask in public (over your nose and mouth) or with others who live outside your household. Never share a mask with others.
- Teach children proper hygiene and the correct way to wear a mask.
- Wash your hands or use hand sanitizer frequently.
- Disinfect surfaces in your car and around your home.

Today, we can confirm:

- TOTAL cases of COVID-19 increased by 484 to 29,296 since yesterday's (1/5) report. Of the 484 new cases, 478 were tested since 12/24/2020.
- ACTIVE cases of COVID-19 increased by 301 to 9,229 since yesterday's (1/5) report.
- 64 residents are known, as a result of contact investigations, to be in the hospital. Contact investigations have not been initiated on all reported cases.
- 14,743 people have clinically recovered.

The Testing Positivity Rate for Montgomery County has increased by 7% from 15% to 22%. This number is updated weekly on Wednesdays.


