Daily COVID-19 Update for Montgomery County

Status Update from the Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management

MONTGOMERY COUNTY – Montgomery County Public Health District, in conjunction with the Montgomery County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, would like to encourage residents to take advantage of mass vaccinations happening now in our county.

Multiple providers are offering first and second doses at Woodforest Stadium in Shenandoah every day this week. If you have questions, please call the Montgomery County COVID-19 Call Center at 936-523-3916. The call center is available Monday - Thursday from 8:00am - 4:30pm or Friday from 8:00 - 4:00pm.

Lone Star Family Health Center, individual hospitals, physicians' offices, and pharmacies also have vaccines available for all adults. Today, we can sadly confirm one additional death related to COVID-19.

- A man in his 70s, from Willis, died in the hospital. He had co-morbidities in addition to testing positive for COVID-19.

We offer our condolences to his family at this difficult time.

We can also confirm:

- TOTAL cases of COVID-19 increased by 150 to 52,078 since Monday's (4/26) report. All 150 new cases were tested since 4/15/2021.
- ACTIVE cases of COVID-19 decreased by 135 to 1,513 since Monday's (4/26) report. On Tuesdays and Fridays, we account for additional inactive cases who we have been unable to contact for 30 days or more. Today, we added 197 inactive cases.

- 115 county residents are known, as a result of contact investigations, to be in the hospital. Contact investigations have not been initiated on all reported cases.
- 27,446 people have clinically recovered.

The Testing Positivity Rate for Montgomery County remains at 8% for the 2nd week. This number is updated weekly on Wednesdays.
