## The Woodlands Township Launches New Tennis Ball Recycling Program

THE WOODLANDS, TEXAS (July 7, 2022) – The Woodlands Township has launched a new tennis ball recycling program in partnership with RecycleBalls, a nonprofit powered by Wilson, to divert waste from landfills. Players can now conveniently recycle tennis balls in the green RecycleBalls bins at five different locations in The Woodlands.

With tennis balls taking more than 400 years to decompose in the landfill, tennis players in The Woodlands are encouraged to "play it green" and start recycling their tennis balls with RecycleBalls.
