Precinct 3 Recycling Center Accepting Yard Debris Free of Charge

Storm Damage Reporting and Cooling Centers in Montgomery County

Residential Design Review Committees ease applications and pre-approvals for storm-related damage

In order to make things a little easier for residents affected by the recent storm, the Residential Design Review Committees (RDRCs) and Development Standards Committee (DSC) will forgo applications and pre-approvals for work needed (fence replacement, tree removal, damage to homes). Focus will be on items, which if not addressed immediately, could affect the safety and wellbeing of persons and property. With or without the application, it remains the owner's/resident's duty to ensure all work is done in accordance with the applicable covenants, standards and residential code requirements. This waiver of applications and approvals will be in effect through September 30, 2023. Read full details.

Township Closures and Updates

The following facilities and services were affected by the storm and will have delayed openings or closures:

- <u>BioBlitz BioBooth</u> has changed their event location, the event will now take place at 8203 Millennium Forest Drive, The Woodlands, Texas 77381.
- The Fired-Up Tour at Station 7, scheduled for June 24, 2023, in Creekside, has been canceled and will be rescheduled at a later date.
- The Rob Fleming Aquatic Center has restored power and will open for normal hours on Saturday (10 a.m. to 8 p.m.)
- May Valley Spray Ground has been reopened and is operational.
- Timmaron Sprayground and May Valley Sprayground will reopen on Saturday, June 24, 2023, and will operate normal hours.
- The Recreation Center at Rob Fleming Park and Texas TreeVentures are closed until further notice due to a power outage.
- The World's Largest Swimming Lesson Event will now be held at Bear Branch Pool.
- Town Center Trolleys and The Woodlands Express are operating as normal.
- Town Hall and The Recreation Center at Bear Branch Park are open. The Recreation Center at Rob Fleming Park is closed.
