

**BOIL WATER NOTICE RESCINDED**  
**MONTGOMERY COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT NO. 47**  
(Public Water System No. TX1700458)  
February 23, 2018

On February 22, 2018, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) required Montgomery County Municipal Utility District No. 47 (MUD 47) to issue a Boil Water Notice to inform customers, individuals, or employees that due to conditions which occurred recently in the public water system, the water from MUD 47 was required to be boiled prior to use for drinking water or human consumption purposes.

MUD 47 has taken the necessary corrective actions to restore the quality of the water distributed for drinking water or human consumption purposes and has provided TCEQ with laboratory test results that indicate the water no longer requires boiling prior to use as of February 23, 2018.

**IMPORTANT ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

MUD 47 has confirmed through additional water quality testing that **there is no *E. coli* bacteria in The Woodlands water distribution system.** The positive bacteria test results were isolated to one single family home located on South Copperknoll Circle. A subsequent investigation has determined that the positive test results were likely caused by repairs to the home's irrigation system. Unfortunately, TCEQ requirements for public posting required that the Boil Water Notice be issued to the entire community even though there was never a widespread concern for water quality.
